Week 1: Rules and Short films week.

Week 2: Stop Motion week.

Fantastic Mr. Fox rated PG

Plot: After 12 years of bucolic bliss, Mr. Fox (George Clooney) breaks a promise to his wife (Meryl Streep) and raids the farms of their human neighbors, Boggis, Bunce, and Bean. Giving in to his animal instincts endangers not only his marriage but also the lives of his family and their animal friends. When the farmers force Mr. Fox and his company deep underground, he has to resort to his natural craftiness to rise above the opposition.

Week 3: Musical Week

Teen Beach Movie rated TV-G

Plot: Two young surfers are swept away by a huge wave, finding themselves acting out a real-life version of the 1960s film 'Wet Side Story'. When their presence derails the movie's intended plot, they must set things right in order to return home.

Week 4: Science Fiction Week

Rowling's popular children's novels about Harry Potter, a boy who learns on his eleventh birthday that he is the orphaned son of two powerful wizards and possesses unique magical powers of his own. He is summoned from his life as an unwanted child to become a student at Hogwarts, an English boarding school for wizards. There, he meets several friends who become his closest allies and help him discover the truth about his parents' mysterious deaths.

Week 6: Animation Week

Kung Fu Panda rated PG

Plot: Po might just be the laziest, clumsiest panda in the Valley of Peace, but he secretly dreams of becoming a Kung Fu legend. When the villainous snow leopard Tai Lung threatens Po's homeland, the hapless panda is chosen to fulfill an ancient prophecy and

defend the Valley from attack. Training under Master Shifu, Po embarks on an epic high-kicking adventure as he sets out to thwart Tai Lung's evil plans. A DreamWorks animation.

Week 7: Anime Week

Spirited Away rated PG

Plot: In this animated feature by noted Japanese director Hayao Miyazaki, 10-year-old Chihiro (Rumi Hiiragi) and her parents (Takashi Naitô, Yasuko Sawaguchi) stumble upon a seemingly abandoned amusement park. After her mother and father are turned into giant pigs, Chihiro meets the mysterious Haku (Miyu Irino), who explains that the park is a resort for supernatural beings who need a break from their time spent in the earthly realm and that she must work there to free herself and her parents.

Spider-Man: Into the Spider-Verse rated PG

Plot: Bitten by a radioactive spider in the subway, Brooklyn teenager Miles Morales suddenly develops mysterious powers that transform him into the one and only Spider-Man. When he meets Peter Parker, he soon realizes that there are many others who share his special, high-flying talents. Miles must now use his newfound skills to battle the evil Kingpin, a hulking madman who can open portals to other universes and pull different versions of Spider-Man into our world.

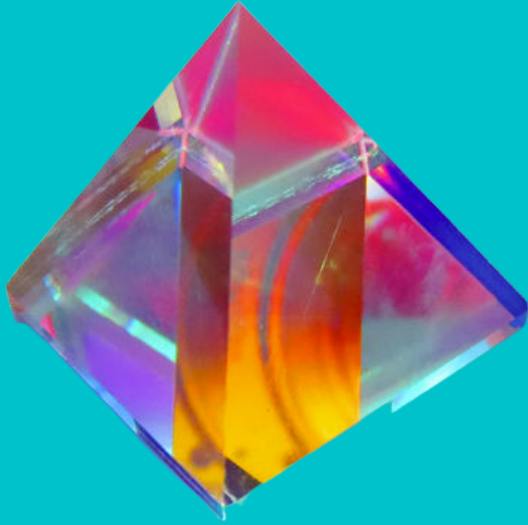

Board Vacancy Announcement

We would appreciate your help in recruiting four remaining candidates for our Board of Trustees. It is acknowledged that membership on the board is voluntary and at no time will it be considered a paid position. Board members may be parents of EKA students; however, it is not a requirement.

Board members' terms are for two years and the terms are staggered so that four members are elected in one year and three the next year. NRS 386.549, the board must have the following make up:

- a) Licensed teacher or other person licensed pursuant to chapter 391 of NRS or who previously held such a license and is retired, as long as his or her license was held in good standing.
- b) Licensed teacher or a school administrator with a license issued by another state or who previously held such a license and is retired, as long as his or her license was held in good standing.
- c) Parent or legal guardian who is not a teacher or employee of the school.
- d) Two members who possess knowledge and expertise in one or more of the following areas:
(1) Accounting; (2) Financial services; (3) Law; or (4) Human resources.

There will be four openings on our Board this year. The four must have knowledge or expertise in at least one of the following areas: 1 MUST be a Licensed teacher or School Administrator, then we need three others with knowledge in Accounting, Financial Services, Law, Human Resources, or they can be an EKA parent. A board member cannot be an employee of the school, a member of an employee's immediate family, or a member of a current board member's immediate family.

The responsibilities of board members are:

- to work collaboratively with the other board members and the administration to implement the vision, mission, and goals of EKA as specified in our strategic plan,
- to maintain compliance with our charter contract with CCSD
- to keep informed of charter school laws,
- to keep informed of EKA board business,
- to attend the meetings of the board, and
- to attend the annual retreat and other board training events as scheduled by the board and administration of EKA.

The guidelines for the election of new board members are as follows: *The prospective board members will be interviewed by the Governing Board of Directors. Applicants will be selected and appointed to the Governing Board at an open Board Meeting.*

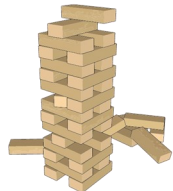

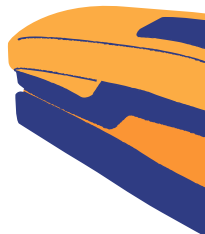
